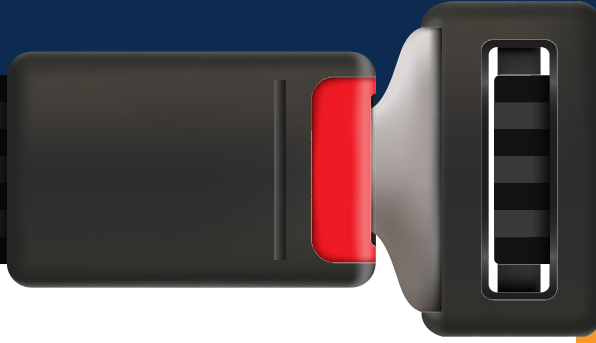

Blissfield Township firefighter, Joseph Todd Gallo, 34, was headed to a barn fire around 4pm on November 17, 2020.

He lost control of his car along a section of gravel road, and his vehicle rolled over several times before coming to a stop.

Captain Gallo was not wearing his seat belt at the time of the accident and he was ejected from the vehicle. He was transported to the Toledo Hospital where he died.
