



BUILDING TRUST AND A CONSTITUTIONALLY SOUND POLICE AGENCY THROUGH TRAINING

This training provides an explanation to community leaders of why police training should be just one component of a more comprehensive professional development program rather than a “check the box” approach. Training which is completed to simply “get it done” will not result in a *Constitutionally Sound Police Agency* that is trusted by the community which in the long term exposes local government, its leaders, police officers, and community members to many risks.

Goals:

- Understand the need to create a culture of not just training but professional development.
- Operating as a *Constitutionally Sound Police Agency* requires time and funding.
- Expecting officers to intervene during the use of excessive force entails more than a policy.
- Identify Emerging Issues – Communities must ensure they provide the tools and resources to prepare their police officers for what will concern the public in the future.
- Understanding the difference between “Racial Profiling” and “Implicit Bias”
