## DYSLEXIA NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION REGULATORY TRAINING & RESOURCES

Dyslexia is a specific learning disability that is neurobiological in origin. It is characterized by difficulties with accurate and/or fluent word recognition and by poor spelling and decoding abilities. These difficulties typically result from a deficit in the phonological component of language that is often unexpected in relation to other cognitive abilities and the provision of effective classroom instruction. Secondary consequences may include problems in reading comprehension and reduced reading experience that can impede growth of vocabulary and background knowledge. (N.J.A.C. 6A:14-1.3) (International Dyslexia Association).

The act mandates the New Jersey Department of Education to provide professional development on reading disabilities, including dyslexia, for various school district personnel. It requires specific teaching staff to complete at least two hours of annual training on related topics.

The professional development shall be made available to general education, special education, basic skills, and English as a second language teachers, instructional support staff, administrators, supervisors, child study team members, and speech-language specialists. The professional development opportunities shall be designed to account for the various manners in which different school district personnel interact with, or develop instructional programs for, students with reading disabilities.

The New Jersey Department of Education (NJ DOE) offers two options to meet the 2-hour professional development requirement as specified in PL 2013 c.105.

- Dyslexia Multisensory Structured Language: Group Instruction Methodology
- Dyslexia Comprehension and Fluency
