

SAFETY DIRECTOR MESSAGE



Every spring, <u>National Work Zone Awareness Week (NWZAW)</u> serves as a vital reminder of the importance of work zone safety for roadway workers, motorists, and the communities they serve. This year, NWZAW will be recognized April 21-25, 2025. This year's theme is "Respect The Zone So We All Go Home."

According to the <u>National Work Zone Safety Clearinghouse</u>, there were approximately 96,000 work zone crashes and 891 work zone fatalities in 2022 alone—a sobering reminder of what's at stake when safety isn't prioritized.
